Re: **LAM Cream and its application to the skin of the breast and face after mastectomy (Breast Cancer) and complications from chemotherapy.**

Dear Ron,

Just to refresh your memory.....**We spoke about my having a left mastectomy and doing chemo now.** I've only had one infusion and next Monday is the second one. It goes on for 4 months or more. **My skin was burning about 1-14 days after,** with dry skin, mouth, lips....like I had a sunburn on the inside that was salty. My capillaries burst in my face and I got rough patches on the bursted capillaries. **Your LAM creme was used day and night on it, and although my skin was sensitive to touch, it was quite effective in keeping it protected. I don't want to be without it now!**

7 months later... 16 February, 2015

Chemo lasted from July through October, with one wonder drug continuing until July 2015. I am still having side effects, although much less severe and **the LAM is still doing great things for my face. All through chemo infusions my skin looked so good. I kept getting compliments on how healthy my skin looked.** There was never any dryness, and I am one of those dry skin types. **I've always had trouble with moisturizers maintaining a subtle look throughout the day, but not since I've been using LAM.**

I feel it helped with some kind of active, itching spot on my face too. It's itching less now, and hardly at all some times. The dermatologist said it could become cancerous, but now it's effects are diminishing. They feel the chemo causes these conditions, but the dry area was there prior to surgery, and so was the dryness of my face. I never have to worry about that now.



Over the holidays, I had 36 radiations to the entire left side of my chest. **I was one of the less than 10% who experience severe radiation burns.** I had a MAJOR suntan! And MAN DID IT HURT! I could hardly move all Xmas holiday. Check the photo.

Of interest is that my alternative doctors have very accurate ways of testing what is best for my body to use. **My body always chose LAM over the prescribed cremes they generally use for radiation.** Surprisingly enough, it also chose chemo and radiation, so I had to put my judgments aside and listen to my body.

I completely covered my breast with LAM twice a day. It's very important that the skin stay moist and

lubricated to prevent scarring, etc. Given the severity of my burns, it's amazing how great my skin looks now. I'm doing amazing!

I did have to get some antibiotic creme due to possible infection, and it cleared up in a couple days after that. I used some calendula ointment and numbing creme prior to the antibiotic, and perhaps the infection was held back a bit because of the calendula, but I don't really think it had much of an effect. Radiation effects compound days after treatment and I had 11 more treatments after this to go. The doctors were impressed at how fast it improved and we were able to finish the treatment protocol.

I learned that sometimes you have to take medication for the pain your body is having to endure, as high levels of pain interfere with the energy necessary to heal whatever assault you're under physically. I am quite the advocate of integrative medicine now, coupling alternative and medical when it's necessities. **Your product needs to be a MAINSTAY for these treatments, and I feel it can prevent medical intervention in most cases.** I'm sure I would have healed without the antibiotic, but I didn't have time to wait on the natural course of events. There's such a time factor with cancer treatments.

I am now in physical therapy for reducing scarring, improving range of motion of my left arm, and preventing lymphedema and cording of the lymph channels. **My therapist applauds how great my breast tissue looks at such a short time after treatment ended.** My range of motion is almost normal now. All I have to do is keep it moisturized and massage it so that the skin doesn't scar and stick to the expander (large plastic insertion to expand the skin for later implants when I get the reconstruction late summer).

As you can see, this is a long process. **My goal is to have NO scar tissue. Your stuff works miracles as far as I'm concerned. The scar I have from the mastectomy is pretty thick and they radiated it more than the whole breast. It seems to be healing back to the way it was before the radiation,** but I feel it will be even better if I keep using the LAM with continued manipulation. I have to wait until my plastic surgeon sees it to find out when I can get my breasts reconstructed. They're supposed to wait 6 months after the radiation so that all is completely healed. I hope I can get mine to heal quicker with minimal or no scar tissue. I do my own spiritual energy work on it too, so I am very positive of the results now.

8 May, 2015 - After my appointment with the plastic surgeon.

My plastic surgeon noticed the great condition that my skin is in 4 months after radiation. He said it looks normal, but will probably act like it's been radiated. One part that was not expanded (stretched) will be the test for pliability when the surgery happens early August. It's hard to believe that it feels like it did before radiation. There was lots of scar tissue, so there's nothing that can be done to minimize that aside from what benefit the LAM is having. We'll see. Stay tuned!

Thank you so much for your gift of bringing wholeness to all of us with your products. I still have a ways to go with all this, but your product has helped me have hope beyond expressions.
